

DVLA - Expired driving licences automatically extended by 11 months

Published: 12/10/2020

Photocard licences or entitlement to drive that expires between 1 February and 31 December 2020 have been extended for 11 months from the date of expiry.

Under the changes, drivers whose photocard driving licence or entitlement to drive runs out between 1 February 2020 and 31 December 2020 will have their entitlement automatically extended from the expiry date, for a period of 11 months. Drivers do not need to apply to renew their licence until they receive a reminder before their extension expires.

The initial extension expired at the end of August. This has now been further extended to the end of the year under temporary changes announced by DVLA today (1 September 2020).

DVLA Chief Executive Julie Lennard said

“Being able to drive is a lifeline for millions of people and this further extension will ensure that in these continued uncertain times, drivers don’t need to worry about the admin or the associated costs with renewing their licences.

The temporary extension is automatic, and drivers do not need to do anything. Drivers who have already applied to renew their photocard driving licence or entitlement to drive can usually carry on driving while we process their application, providing they have not been told by their doctor or optician that they should not drive.”

The initial extension from the EU expired at the end of August and we have now agreed a further extension with the EU to the end of December.

The extension only applies to full driving licences, not provisional driving licences.

If a driver applies to DVLA to renew their photocard or their entitlement, they can continue to drive while DVLA is considering their application, providing they have not been told by their doctor or optician that they should not drive. Further information is available [here](#).

By law, all drivers must ensure they always meet the medical standards for fitness to drive when driving. Information about driving with a medical condition is available on GOV.UK.



DVLA - Online duplicate log book service launched

The time it takes motorists to receive a duplicate log book (V5C) has been slashed from 6 weeks to just 5 days, as a result of a new online service launched this week by DVLA.

The 'Get a vehicle log book (V5C)' service is the latest DVLA online service, and has been designed for motorists who have lost or damaged their log book.

This will be the second online service DVLA has launched in the last 4 months, following the change address on vehicle log book service which was launched in June and has been used more than 300,000 times.

Every year, DVLA issues around 500,000 duplicate log books where motorists have either lost or damaged their document.

Julie Lennard, DVLA Chief Executive, said:

"DVLA's new online service to apply for a duplicate log book is quick and easy to use and means customers who have unfortunately either lost or damaged theirs will receive their new document within a matter of days."

"We know how important a log book is to motorists so if you have lost or damaged yours, the quickest way to get your duplicate document is go to GOV.UK."

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Driving the Jag made me feel like a VIP and a 60's villain both at the same time, even though it was a money pit and went through two electronic ignitions in 6 months! Mind you; apart from all the appreciative glances, the best complement occurred in the local garage where I was having some paintwork done. A know-all work colleague saw me looking over the Jag and said, "I bet you wish that was yours, well dream on". I simply said, "It is". I borrowed the garage's trolley jack to help lift his chin off the deck.

Another memorable time with the Jag, was taking it to my nephew's wedding, with white ribbon tied from the leaping cat to the sun visors. It out classed all the modern Euro-boxes, but my joy was cut short on the way home when the clutch master cylinder seal departed, requiring lots of double-de-clutching to get me home.

In addition to the Jag and Spitfire, my dreams of having a shed full of other classic cars is dependent upon either Camelot or Ernie being kind. So, in the meantime I shall keep and enjoy my MGB, tinkering in bad weather weekends, and the hope of giving it plenty of sunny exercise whenever possible.

I've provided a picture of the Jag and the Spitfire, with the thought of 'It is better to loved and lost, than never loved at all'.

By the way, if you have not been to the Goodwood Revival yet, try to get there at least once, as you won't regret it. As apart from the classic racing, the paddock, the air shows, the music, side-shows, special events, memorabilia and a car park full of fantastic sports and classic cars worth millions, it's great fun to dress up in 1940s to 1960s outfits and join in with the spirit of that thrilling era. 
