

History of Drive it Day

NDSCCC's and clubs National "Drive It Day" – **April 26th 2020**

First introduced in 2005, the FBHVC (The Federation of British Historic Vehicles Club) sets the date each year to be as close as possible to the anniversary of the "1000 mile Trial" run in 1900.

The Royal Automobile Club organised the 1000 miles motor tour through England and Scotland starting from Hyde Park Corner on April 23rd 1900 – Yes that was a 1000 mile trial for automobiles in 1900 and 70 vehicles took part, even more impressively, 46 finished!

To put this into context, The first four-wheeled petrol-driven automobile in Britain was built in Walthamstow by Frederick Bremer in 1892. Another was made in Birmingham in 1895 by Frederick William Lanchester, who also patented the disc brake. This is in the context of the World's first recognised car designed and built by Karl Benz in 1885.

The route was as follows:

First day London to Bath and Bristol. (118 miles)

Day 2- Bristol, Gloucester, Worcester to Birmingham. (43 miles)

Day 3- Birmingham, Derby, Matlock, Buxton to Manchester. (49.5 miles) Taddington Hill climb (2.5 miles)

Day 4 - Manchester, Preston to Kendal. (73.75 miles) Optional Shap Fell hill climb (7.5 miles)

Day 5- Kendal, Keswick to Carlisle. (61.5miles)

Day 6- Carlisle, Peebles to Edinburgh. (100 Miles) Dunmail Rise (1.75 miles)

Day 7- Edinburgh, Berwick to Newcastle. (121.5 miles)

Day 8- Newcastle, Durham, York to Leeds. (103 miles)

Day 9- Leeds, Harrogate, Bradford to Sheffield. (74 miles)

Day 10- Sheffield, Welbeck, Park, Lincoln, Nottingham. (82.25 miles)

Day 11- Nottingham, Leicester, Northampton, St. Albans, London (Marble Arch). (122.75 miles)

The tour lasted from April 23rd to May 12th, and included hill-climbing competitions, races in Welbeck Park, and exhibitions at the different towns.

Frank Hedges Butler (1855-1928), a balloonist and pioneer of British flying took part in his 1887 Panhard-Levassor. Hedges-Butler wrote of the Tour:

"The tour was most enjoyable, but involved hard work, as we had to be up in the morning every day at five o'clock to get the cars ready.

My daughter Vera travelled all the course with me, and mine was one of the cars that came in at the finish. We had several punctures; piston rings working round lost a good deal of compression; a lift-pin of one of the valves put one cylinder out of action part of the time; and burners blew out up hill.

There were two sections for cars in the tour, one for manufacturers and agents and the other for amateurs.

The legal speed was only fourteen miles an hour, so that we had often to wait at the controls before entering the towns."




Prizes and medals were presented by the Automobile Club at this historic event and classic car clubs celebrate it with our "Drive it" day!

This month—Santa and his Sleigh


The Golden Pencil award (announced via email late last year) is made to one author selected at random from any club member who contributes a personal article & picture to the club magazine in the year between AGMs.

Although my sleigh is a classic, it is in fact a state-of-the-art marvel of engineering. My elves have adapted an autopilot system from Tesla and merged it with the altitude control system from a Boeing 737. Which reminds me, I must get the software checked!

Elf and Safety is paramount, as is invisibility, so the sleigh is equipped with a special blind spot monitoring system from Volvo specifically designed to alert me and my reindeer to the presence of any children. The dashboard is dominated by a MPS detector (Mince Pie and Sherry) and an Apple GPS. Being Apple, it has a software update 3 times a day! The Smiths speedometer on the dashboard allows me to monitor the required flying speed of 650 miles per second, (well, as it's Smiths it fluctuates between 400 and 800—but near enough) and a CB radio keeps constant touch with Mrs. Claus (handle = momma santa) The cargo hold, or present compartment, is in the form of a traditional sack and really acts as a portal between the sleigh and the North Pole. The sleigh's power unit is only 7 brp (brake reindeer power) so this is supplemented with a battery and electric motor, for a high-tech, hybrid powertrain similar to a Toyota Prius. This "green" solution even allows me to use the single occupancy lanes in Bristol without being charged.

Any convertible driver will tell you that a massive overcoat and woolly hat isn't enough to keep you warm on the coldest days ... never mind at night, and as I don't go camping or have a degree in Tent-ology, I've given up trying to erect the Morgan roof (ask Diane and Mark!). To get around this the elves have taken heated seats, heated control stick and an Aircar system from a Mercedes Benz to keep me warm. The runners are developed from Citroën, it looks simple but underneath its as complex as hell, with suspension, brakes and reindeer steering all interconnected.

With luck, it'll last a few more years yet! Ho! Ho! Ho!

Check Your Bulbs

Sounds simple, but when was the last time you gave your bulbs the once over? Some modern cars warn drivers via a warning light if a bulb has failed, but it's always a good idea to check the car's lights before any journey to make sure you don't get caught out.

Checking for damage to the lenses is also a good idea, to ensure moisture or debris cannot damage the bulb too.

It's also good practice to keep a spare set of bulbs in the car, especially if your car is older, as bulbs are more likely to fail. Sounds simple - good advice usually is.

Cleanliness

Again, another simple yet effective tip. The roads in winter are covered in salt and mud from the harsher weather, which have a habit of making your car seem to be forever filthy.

By regularly cleaning your car, headlights, taillights etc. will be more effective, as they won't have layers of dirt reducing their ability to project light. Lights ensure you and your car can be seen, so it's general safety advice to keep them as clean as possible.

If you can't get your car clean, a simple once over on the lights and number plates with a damp cloth will suffice.

Allow More Time

Another simple, yet effective tip for driving at night. Unfortunately, trickier conditions mean that accidents, and therefore traffic build up, is far more likely. Therefore, to keep ahead of the game allow more time for your journey.

It can be stressful if you are up against the clock, so allow more time and you'll be less stressed meaning you'll be more at ease and can concentrate on driving, rather than being late!

Use main beam wisely

Your car's main beam is useful for those country roads with no street lights. But it's important to make sure you don't dazzle oncoming traffic.

So always be aware of oncoming vehicles, and proceed with caution around bends, maybe using your regular beam to not dazzle cars that could be approaching the corner from the opposite way.

Drive Slower

Common sense can go a long way. With decreased visibility, especially on poorly lit roads, it is always a good idea to slow your speed down, then you'll always have time to react, if a hazard is presented in front of you.

Initiative is obviously a key factor here, so don't slow down to a pace that will turn you into an even bigger hazard, but reducing your speed slightly where needed is a sensible idea
